Growing Medium	Free-draining sandy loam with 40% green waste added
Netting	10mm nylon support net . Very fine, easy to cut or tear
Vegetation	20:80 grass and wild flower mix. 42 Perennial and Biennial species, native to the UK.
Roll dimensions	1000 mm wide x 1000mm long 1000mm wide x 2000m long
Roll weight	Up to 24Kg unless mat is very wet due to rain on the day of harvest
Soil Thickness	20mm
Height of Sward	approx. 100mm at time of despatch. Flowering height approx. 90cm
Seed mix	See overleaf
Flowering period	April-September
Preferred Aspect	Sun

What is Meadowmat for Birds and Bees?

A mixture of perennial plants native to the UK that encourage wildlife into the garden

- May flower in the first year...depending when it is installed

Laying Meadowmat

Ground Preparation:

For best results, install Meadowmat on to impoverished soil.

Remove all vegetation, dig or rotovate to a depth of at least 15cm. Rake to a fine tilth.

Laying

Unroll on to damp ground and press down gently to ensure good contact with the soil.

Maintenance

Once established, Meadowmat for Birds and Bees is easy to care for :

March—January: allow Meadowmat to grow, flower and set seed.

January/February: cut back to 8-10 cm high, and remove all cuttings



Meadowmat is grown on to a free draining growing medium supported by a fine net.

Please note that species and proportions may vary according to availability of the seed, the time of year, weather patterns and other variables beyond our control. Once Meadowmat for Birds and Bees has been established in your garden, the mix of species is likely to change as the plants adapt themselves to their new growing conditions.

Grasses: Meadow Barley, Quaking Grass, Red Fescue, Sheeps Fescue

Flowering plants: Agrimony, Autumn Hawkbit, Birdsfoot Trefoil, Black Medick, Chicory, Common Daisy, Common Knapweed, Common Sorrel, Common Toadflax, Fox and Cubs, Great Mullein, Greater Celandine, Maiden Pink, Meadow Buttercup, Meadow Cranesbill, Meadowsweet, Musk Mallow, Opium Poppy, Ragged Robin, Red Campion, Red Clover, Small Scabious, Tansy, Teasel, Vipers Bugloss, Welsh Poppy, White Campion, White Clover, White Deadnettle, Wild Basil, Wild Carrot, Wild Marjoram, Wild Thyme, Yarrow
